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2023 Activities and Accomplishments

Since our last annual meeting, ASA has been working hard to support the industry. Among many accomplishments throughout the year, highlights include:

- 2021 IBC Engineering Standards were produced by Reverence Engineering. The standards are available for use by members in communities that have adopted the 2021 IBC. Updates are being made to improve the package at this time.
- This year ASA has participated in regulatory activity in the following jurisdictions:
 - City of Phoenix (EMC use permit issues)
 - Pima County (Outdoor Lighting Code)
 - City of Glendale (sign code update)
 - Town of Camp Verde (sign code update)
 - City of Casa Grande (development of new business friendly sign code)
 - City of Flagstaff (sign code update)
 - o Cochise County (outdoor lighting regulations)
 - City of Scottsdale (code SWOT analysis process)
- James Carpentier also presented a session at the APA Arizona State Planning Conference and exhibited at their small trade show.
- ASA/ISA's work in the legislative arena to protect the interests of its members represents the most significant value proposition for ASA members.
